NCEM, in partnership with the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction (DPI), the North Carolina Center for Safer Schools (CFSS), and the Department of Information Technology (DIT) executed the state procurement process last year for a statewide solution that would meet the needs of public and charter schools across the state and would complement existing efforts, such as the State Emergency Response Application (SERA) and the School Risk Management Plan (SRMP).

As a result of this procurement process, the State is making the Rave Panic Button application available to all public K-12 school districts and K-12 charter schools across North Carolina. Officials from the North Carolina Department of Public Safety (DPS), NCEM, DPI, and the CFSS recently met in Raleigh to discuss the application's rollout with stakeholders from public safety, to include PSAPs, law enforcement, and emergency services, as well as education.

## **2. 2023 SERT Statewide Exercise Series**

Ahead of the 2023 SERT Statewide Exercise, several exercise components will be implemented in order to strengthen both capabilities and partnerships. This series will include WebEOC update training, internal cyber defense exercises, and tabletop activities.
