BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners of Nash County, North Carolina:

Section 1. The following amounts are hereby appropriated in the General Fund for the operation of county government and its activities for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2026, in accordance with the chart of accounts heretofore established for this county:

Section 5. The County used Grant Project and Capital Project budgets and incorporates these budgets into the financial and accounting systems. These Project Funds are used to account for Capital Projects and Grant Projects that span multiple fiscal years to complete. Funds not expended at June 30, 2025 for capital or grant projects previously approved in Budget Ordinances or Budget Amendments will be brought forward in order to complete the project. These projects include the CDBG Grants (including CDBG-CV), Single Family Housing Rehabilitation Program Grants, Homeland Security Grant, Urgent Repair Program Grants, Hazard Mitigation Grants, Debris Removal Grant, ARPA Grant Funds, COVID-19 Grants, NC State Fund Projects, Down East Consortium Project Funds, Middlesex Corporate Park Project, Nashville Corporate Park Projects, Highway 97 Industrial Park Projects, Miracle Park at Coopers Project, Detention Center Renovation/Expansion Project, Northern Nash Field House Project, Animal Facility Project, Highspeed Internet Project, Senior Center Renovation Project, Nash County Public School Projects, Water Projects and Solid Waste Expansion Project.

Section 6. The following taxes are hereby levied for the fiscal year 2025-2026. The County-wide tax rate is set at SIXTY-THREE cents (\$.63) per one hundred dollars (\$100) valuation of property listed for taxes as of January 1, 2025, for the purpose of raising the revenues listed as "Current Ad Valorem Taxes" in the General Fund. This county-wide rate of tax is based on an estimated total valuation of \$11,353,126,436 and an estimated collection rate of 98%. The revenue-neutral rate was published after the 2024 revaluation year as defined by G.S. 159-11E at a rate of \$.575.

Section 7. The following special fire district taxes are hereby levied for the fiscal year 2025-2026 as authorized by G. S. 69-25.4:

Section 8: Charges for services and fees by County departments, excluding those established by state statute, are levied in the amounts set forth in the attached Fee Schedule (Attachment 1)

Section 9: There is hereby levied for the fiscal year 2025-2026, a tax on the license for the permits for retail sale of wine and beer in Nash County in the maximum amount permitted to be levied by counties.

Section 10: The County Manager is hereby authorized to transfer appropriations within a fund as contained herein under the following conditions:

- I. The County Manager may transfer amounts between objects of expenditure within a department without limitation and without a report being requested.
- II. The County Manager may transfer amounts up to \$10,000 between departments of the same fund with an official report on such transfers at the next regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners.
- III. The County Manager may transfer \$25,000 from any contingency appropriation within a fund with an official report on such transfers to the Board of Commissioners.
- IV. The County Manager may approve the transfer of all capital appropriations, as budgeted in the County Capital Improvements to the departmental line item budget without being brought back to the Board of Commissioners for approval
- V. The County Manager may authorize amendments as requested by the Finance Officer at the end of the fiscal year in order to maintain budgetary compliance for the reporting of leases (GASB 87), subscription based information technology agreements (GASB 96), the Social Services Representative Payee Fund and Fines & Forfeitures with a report to the Board of Commissioners.

Section 11: Contractual Obligations, the County Manager and her designee are hereby authorized to execute contractual documents under the following conditions:

- I. They may award and execute contracts from construction or repair projects which do not require formal competitive procedures that are within budgeted departmental appropriations.
- II. They may reject bids and re-advertise for bids for all formal bids of apparatus, supplies, material and equipment as stated in G. S. 143-129.
- III. They may award and execute contracts for (1) purchases of apparatus, supplies and materials, or equipment that do not require formal competitive bid procedures and within the budgeted departmental appropriations; (2) leases of non capital assets within departmental appropriations; and (3) contracted and professional services which are within budgeted departmental appropriations.
- IV. They may execute grant agreements to and from public and non-profit organizations which are within budgeted appropriations, unless a grantor organization requires execution by the Board of Commissioners.
- V. They may execute contracts, as the lessor or lessee of real property, which are of a duration of one year or less which are within the budgeted departmental appropriations.
- VI. The County Manager may approve change orders up to \$25,000 per occurrence within a budgeted project with an official report to the Board of Commissioners.
- VII. They are authorized to declare surplus any personal property valued at less than Thirty Thousand Dollars for any one item or group of items, to set its fair market value, and to convey title to the property for the county in accordance with N.C.G.S. 160A-266 ( c ).

Section 12: Reserves for Encumbrances, the reserves for encumbrance on June 30, 2025; and carry over appropriation representing prior commitments as of that date shall be re-appropriated pursuant to NCGS 159-13 to the departments within the various funds unless excluded by the County Manager. Expenditures against these encumbrances may be made during fiscal year 2025-2026 as the previous commitments are satisfied.

Section 13: The Court Facility Fees as received under the Statutes of the State of North Carolina by the County treasury are hereby appropriated to be used in the maintenance and operations of the court areas and the repairing or provisions of furnishings as required and approved.

Section 14: Copies of the 2025-2026 Budget as provided herein remain open for public inspection and have been furnished to the Budget Officer, Finance Officer, Tax Administrator and Clerk to the Board of County Commissioners as required by the laws of the State of North Carolina.

Section 15: The Nash County Budget Ordinance for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2025 and ending June 30, 2026 was adopted by the Nash County Board of Commissioners after a public hearing held on June 2, 2025 on the proposed 2025-2026 Budget in accordance with North Carolina General Statutes.

This Ordinance is adopted the 16 day of June 2025.

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
